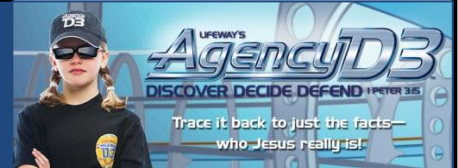

Director of Missions



By now, all the red and green signs of Christmas have been wrapped, packed, and stored away for another year. The favorite chair has been returned to its desired location, and the tree that temporarily filled the spot is nowhere in sight. The days before Christmas are an exciting time; however, most adults are relieved to view the activities from the rear view mirror. Now is the time to project forward into the New Year, prayerfully capturing God's vision for His Church.

While I was at home during the Christmas break, I read through the Sweetwater Baptist Association, 2013 Book of Reports. There were many things that caught my attention and evoked the theme, "I Stand Amazed". It is amazing we have the support of 73 "churches working together sharing Jesus". This common goal provides a total membership of over 20,500 people. Laboring together, our congregations reported 368 new members baptized and added 341 other additions to the fold.

The amount of support given to the Hope for Haiti project literally amazes me. Because of your gifts, we are able to move to the second stage of construction on the church building. This summer the metal structure to support the second floor will be installed, making it feasible to complete the building next year (2015).

The ingredient that seems to permeate the Association that has truly blessed my soul is your acceptance of your Director of Missions. I stand amazed and humbled by your prayers and kindness.

Borrowing slightly from the words of John, as he addressed the churches in Revelation, I have this concern about our association: Baptism. According to the reports from the churches, approximately twenty churches reported ZERO baptisms. The issue is not those churches, but to raise the focus of winning the lost to Christ. Sharing Christ and His love must be an intentional act. As the Director of Missions of the Sweetwater Baptist Association, it becomes my responsibility to encourage, equip, and whenever possible, empower each congregation as it shares the message of Christ's saving grace.

I hope you will not object if I make a few suggestions that may be helpful. (Besides, advice is free and easy to ignore.)

- 1) Gather church leadership for a meeting to address the issue of baptism
- 2) Consider starting or adjusting a visitation program
- 3) Plan and pray for revival with the purpose of reaching the unchurched
- 4) Start now planning your Vacation Bible School
 - a. Make sure a follow-up team is used to contact families after children come to VBS (many will make professions of faith)

- 5) Consider studying and participating in a Harvest 1-5-1 program (contact the SBA Office or see TBC for further information)
- 6) Consider hosting special events related to the church such as: friend's day, back to school event, special services during school breaks, an evening for adults (remember focus on the lost)

I look forward to visiting all of our churches during this year. I think of you often and I stand amazed at all you accomplish. From the foothills of the Smoky Mountains, your love and hand of ministry reach beyond the world's imagination. I know in 2014 your ministry will be felt in places like Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Iowa, and West Virginia, as well as other places, here at home and around our world. I know you will not forget the next door neighbor who needs Christ. May God bless you as you GO!

HOPE FOR HAITI: Work on the church/school building in Haiti continues. In early January of this year, a construction company in Haiti was contracted to provide metal beams and steel for the roof support that is between the first and second floors of the building. It is anticipated that the completion for this phase of work will be approximately 10 months. In addition to the hired construction company workers, Pastor Gaetan Alcegaire and other workers from the Children's Orphanage, will be given an opportunity during this time to provide some of the hired work for the construction company.

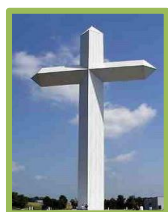

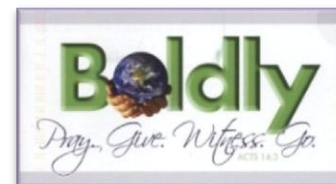

YOUTH COMMITTEE: In my article for this issue of the newsletter, I want to take a few moments to encourage all youth workers. Let me remind you, that as a youth worker, you have one of the highest callings in the universe. Keep pouring into those teens. You're making a difference, even if you don't

see it. Don't be discouraged. And, don't you quit! Oh, and if you haven't been told lately (and you probably haven't)...**THANK YOU!**

God has allowed me to have a calling and a career in helping (or at least trying to help) teens. It is an extremely rewarding, and many times frustrating field. From pop quizzes to pregnancy...from acne to abortion...from dances to death, I've seen a staggering variety of situations in nearly fifteen years of working with young people. As

we all know, to some extent, the American teenage years are anything but stable. Not only are drastic changes happening inside them, but also in their social world. Relationship statuses fluctuate. Boyfriend, girlfriend, best friend, tons of friends...today. No friends...tomorrow! But, let's not be so naive as to think that the teens' problems are not as real or important as ours. Because they are. Listen adults, we may sometimes try to dismiss teenage problems by saying "Oh, that's just how it is with kids" or "It's not that big of a deal. They change from one day to the next. It'll all be okay tomorrow." But, the fact is, even the seemingly little things are very big and very real to them. Yes, situations may change tomorrow, but that doesn't give them much help or hope for today! Remember, even though your problems and those of the teens in your life may differ, the pressures of those problems are very similar. Be there for your teen. Listen. Don't always dominate the conversation. Let me say again...listen. Then, with every smile, with every tear, with every word of advice...point them to Jesus! Remind them that He's there, and He's very active in their world...in their life. Remind them of how His Word says to be "Casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). Hang in there...and hang on to your teens!

INFORMATION FOR CHURCH

TREASURERS: The IRS requires charitable organizations (including churches) to provide written receipts for individual donations of \$250.00 or more.



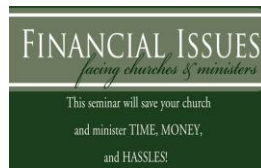
For amounts less than \$250.00, a written receipt is not required; however, it is recommended that churches provide an annual itemized statement to each of its contributors, regardless of the amount of the donation. The statement should cover the January-December tax year and given to the contributor in a timely manner, for use in filing income tax returns. This written statement should include the following information:

- 1) The name and address of the church;
- 2) The date and amount of each donation;
- 3) A statement that the only benefit received in lieu of the donation was intangible religious benefit (meaning no goods or services were given to the individual making the donation).

JUST A NOTE: The SBA Office has a supply of carbonless forms W2, W3, 1099 and 1096. These are available to our churches and are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please stop by the SBA Office to pick up the forms that are needed for your church.

VONORE BAPTIST CHURCH: We are so pleased to announce that Dr. Doug Sager has agreed to serve as our Pastor. Dr. Sager has served nine churches in four states. Most recently, he served as Senior Pastor of Concord Baptist Church, Concord, TN. He served there from 1993 until 2013. He is married to Elizabeth Faye Thompson and they have three children and five grandchildren. In 1961, Dr. Sager received his BA degree from Howard College in Birmingham, AL; in 1965 he received his Master of Theology from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary; and in 1975, he received his Doctor of Ministry degree from Luther Rice Seminary. A characteristic common to all of his pastorates has been substantial growth. When Dr. Sager began his ministry at FBC Concord in 1993, the average SS attendance was 816. During his pastorate, that average grew to over 2300. Dr. Sager has held numerous leadership positions with the International Mission Board; he is a Former President of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and Trustee for the Baptist Sunday School Board.



Dr. Sager will be leading an in-depth study of the Book of Revelation on Sunday evenings, beginning at 6:00 p.m. Everyone is invited to join us for this study.
