Storm Shelter: This past week the term "storm shelter" took on a new meaning as tornado



warnings filled the air waves from radio and television stations. By mid-afternoon on Friday, March 2nd warnings became realities as the twisting funnel clouds began their devastating assault on our communities. Trees were reduced to toothpicks, homes were shifted from their foundations, and rooftops were relocated to neighbor's backyards. One man found a new vehicle parked in his driveway. Students felt the reality of what they had practiced for years as they huddled beneath their desks before moving to the hallway. Nervous adults and frantic children trembled while being thankful for being sheltered from the storm.

When the glaring sound of storm warnings draws our attention from routine activities, instructions of how to remain secure follows. We are told to stay away from windows, go to the lowest place in the home, cover ourselves with a mattress or pillows, remain calm, and continue to listen for further instructions. Following good advice is a mark of wisdom according to the book of Proverbs. It is natural to think of brick buildings and block walls as means of protection. Yet, we as believers also confess that there is a greater source that hedge around the children of God. David's cry to God was, "For thou hast been a shelter for me, and a strong tower from the enemy," Psalm 61:3.

Several of our churches in the tornado ravaged area are being such a shelter. Meals are being served, downed trees are being removed from homes, clothing and food pantries are opened, and laundry and shower trailers are being provided to those in need. We are discovering that as God's Spirit hovers over us in a caring manner, He also allows us to participate in extending His loving touch to others.

We will need to continue to provide a storm shelter for those hurting victims. If you have chain saw teams, light construction teams, cooks, people willing to pull brush, or any willing heart, contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association office and we will make the arrangement so lives can be touched in the name of Christ.

Great comfort comes from the thought of being sheltered in the arms of God. Our upcoming simultaneous revivals are offering such a gift to those that do not know the comforting arms of a loving Lord. Our prayers are that many discover this sheltering place that is made possible through His marvelous grace.

God is also allowing us to be His storm shelter as we reach out to the children in Haiti. Several churches are surrendering to the Master's call in providing for the needs of the orphans who have suffered the effects of a devastating storm. There is still time for your church to be an extension of those precious sheltering arms.

Doesn't it make you feel good to be involved in the lives of those who are in despair and have loss of hope? It also feels good to be safe in the "Storm Shelter!"

TELLICO PLAINS TORNADO: Friday, March 2nd, a category EF2 tornado hit Tellico downtown Plains and the surrounding area. It was estimated that the tornado was on ground for



approximately 14 miles. It was reported that sixty-five homes were damaged, thirty-five homes were completely destroyed, and amazingly no fatalities.


wonderful, powerful God we worship.

In addition, Messengers voted at the 2011 Annual Meeting of the Sweetwater Baptist Association to enter into a 5-year partnership with Pastor Gaetan Alcegaire. Pastor Geatan is founder and minister of the Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphan in Haiti. Presently, we are helping to feed, clothe and house 32 orphans in Port-au-Prince, Haiti at the orphanage operated



by Pastor Gaetan. We are continuing to ask families, churches, Sunday school classes, WMU groups or any group within a congregation to consider supporting a child at the orphanage for \$100.00 a month.
