



**OH Grace, Where Art Thou?** Several years ago, I came across a sermon titled, "Grace is not a five-foot-two, blue-eyed blond." To say the least, the title caught

my attention. The essence of the presentation was that grace is not always, what we think. However, most of the readers of this article will understand grace as an action of God toward undeserving sinners. We may not fully understand the impact of Christ's action on the cross; we do however appreciate the tremendous change it brings in our lives. In these terms, grace is an intentional, deliberate, premediated thought of our heavenly Father.

Grace is also an attribute of Christianity. Jesus clearly sets the example of the loving actions of a Holy God. Countless illustrations are contained in the Scriptures from the woman caught in adultery to the thief on the cross. Neither deserved to experience the greatest gift of all, forgiveness. Yet, Jesus never refused the opportunity to convert an embarrassing situation into a glorious encounter. This unique grace is what the church is to demonstrate to a lost and dying world. In November, the Sweetwater Baptist Association collected approximately 450 bags of groceries in the "Thanksgiving Meal-in-a-Bag" program, which fed over 1,200 people. Approximately 150 or more additional bags were delivered by our churches. Grace was seen in the eyes of many who received the food, but it was also evident in those who distributed the much-needed nourishment.

Grace is also the unlimited compassion of a Christian heart. Peter asked Jesus a question in Matthew 18:21, "How often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Till seven times?" Jesus' response was "I say not unto thee, until seven times but, seventy times seven." It is the nature of a child of God to forgive as the Father has forgiven us. In my life situation, I know I am not infallible or inerrant, as are the Scriptures and the grace of my Father. For me, the need of forgiveness is and will always be a necessity. I recall that Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount that our forgiveness is based on our ability to forgive others. If not, we are measured by the same degree that we hold others. In forgiveness, we find the grace that is often missing.

Grace will be evident at this year's Evangelism Conference. Dr. Thom Rainer will be our guest speaker. He is the President of Lifeway and the author of several books. Three of his recent books have gained recommendations: "I am a Church Member," "Autopsy of a Deceased Church," and "I Will." Please prepare for this conference by prayer, encouraging others to attend and arriving early on January 25, 2016 at Notchey Creek Baptist Church.

In fact, we pray that everything accomplished through the Association in 2016 is bathed in prayer and conducted in grace. Oh Grace, where art thou? Generated at the throne of God and lodged deep in the heart of God's children.

Oh Grace, where art thou? Grace is at the foot of the cross. Grace is in the restoration of a fallen saint. Grace is in the eyes of a loving Father Grace is hands of those who serve. Grace is cooperating. Grace is holding the hurting. Grace is being His! Thank You Father for GRACE.



GUATEMALA MISSION **PROJECT:** Recently the Tennessee Baptist Convention Guatemala Baptist and Convention confirmed plans for Sweetwater Baptist Association mission projects in Guatemala for 2016.

Projects have now been approved for June

21-28 for Bethlehem, Notchey Creek and Vonore. Tentative plans call for youth to serve on these mission teams, in addition to adult volunteers. Mission volunteers will continue ministry work in the same locations of Guatemala where work was begun by teams in 2015. Bethlehem has indicated that nurses will be needed to serve on the mission project in June to help distribute vitamins and participate in medical clinics.

An adult evangelism project has also been approved for late September/early October (the date for this project is still flexible due to purchase of airline tickets.) Please contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association if you or your church is interested in serving on a revival mission team in Guatemala in 2016. Missionary Garry Eudy shared that the Pacific Coast area is one of the largest regions of Guatemala, so there is potential for more of our churches to work in other churches in this region of Guatemala.

Mission volunteers must have a valid passport and any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department. The Tennessee Baptist Convention requires all participants to attend an orientation meeting, as well as More-Life, cross-cultural, security, travel safety, and child protection training. Much of the training is available online or at the SBA Office.







### **REMINDER FOR CHURCH TREASURERS:**

The IRS requires charitable organizations (including churches) to provide written receipts for individual donations of \$250.00 or more. For amounts less than \$250.00, a written receipt is not required. However, it is recommended that churches provide an annual itemized statement



to each contributor, regardless of the amount of donation. The statement should cover the January-December tax year and given to the contributor in a timely manner, for use in filing income tax returns. This written receipt should include the following information:

- 1) Name and address of the church;
- 2) Date and amount of each donation;
- 3) Statement that no goods or services were given to individual making donation.






Pastor Jeremy McNally and wife Brandi – Island Creek
