REPORT FROM ANNUAL MEETING, 2023: *He Restoreth My Soul* was the theme for the 2023 Annual *Meeting.* Thank you, Pastor Rick Atkins and New Providence Baptist Church, for hosting Messengers as they gathered for the 193rd Session of the Sweetwater



Baptist Association. The opening welcome and prayer were presented by Pastor Rick Atkins. Steve Pearson shared a word of greetings from the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board, and presented a plaque on behalf of churches of the Sweetwater Baptist Association that participated in the *Golden Mission Offering*. The *Memorial Report* included *Dedication of the 2023 Minutes* of the Association in memory of former pastors: Dennis Lee Robinson and Julius Franklin (Frank) Hicks. These men were beloved and faithful servants to this Association and our Lord. They will be sadly missed.

We thank our Moderator, Darrell Cardin, for his kind spirit and outstanding leadership. During the Moderator's Message, he reminded us that when we get mixed up, and when our soul needs fixing, *send it*



back to the Maker...God is in control, so enjoy the journey. The Lingerfelts were a blessing as they shared the special music for the service. In addition, Vice-Moderator David Lane did an exceptional job in leading the Business Session. Items approved by *Messengers* included: David Lane (Pastor of Citico) will serve as Moderator and Jamie Johnson (Pastor of Delano) was elected as Vice-Moderator for 2023-2024; and a proposed budget of \$217,422.00 was approved.

The Director of Missions *Report* indicated that churches have continued to be on mission here at home and around our world. Mission volunteers, Lance Hamilton, Javin Parson and Carroll Hamilton shared of the



work in Guatemala, as they participated in distributing food bags, witnessing at a rehabilitation clinic and door-to-door visits while sharing the love of Christ. Relief efforts, funds and supplies were shared in Tennessee, Kentucky and Ukraine. It was also reported that short-term mission projects are being planned for 2024.

We want to thank Pastors, Messengers and visitors from churches represented that were in attendance for the sessions. We want to thank our host church, New Providence Baptist Church and Pastor Rick Atkins for the gracious welcome. (It was a joy to worship in this beautiful new sanctuary.) We also want to thank everyone that served on the program for this year's *Annual Meeting*.

WHO IS LOTTIE MOON?

Lottie Moon was born Charlotte Digges Moon on December 12, 1840, in Albemarle County, Virginia. It is said Lottie rebelled against Christianity until she was in college, but in December



1858, dedicated her life to Christ at First Baptist Church, Charlottesville, Virginia.

Lottie was 32 years old when appointed to Tengchow, China where she served for 39 years as a missionary. She had turned down a marriage proposal and left her job, home and family to follow God's lead. Her path wasn't typical for an educated woman from a wealthy Southern family. God had gripped her with the Chinese peoples' need for a Savior. She taught in a girls' school and often made trips into China's interior to share the Good News with women and girls. Lottie Moon was passionate about people knowing Christ. People of China feared and rejected her, but she refused to leave. The aroma of fresh-baked cookies drew children to her house. She adopted traditional Chinese dress, and she learned China's language and customs. Lottie identified with the people, and many eventually accepted her, and some accepted her Savior. Lottie frequently sent letters back home detailing Chinese culture, missionary life and the physical and spiritual needs of the Chinese people. Additionally, she challenged Southern Baptists to go to China or give so that others could go. By 1888, Southern Baptist women had organized and helped collect \$3,315 to send to workers in China.

IN 1918, Women's Missionary Union (WMU) named the annual Christmas offering for international missions after Lottie Moon. Lottie Moon's life is a reminder of why we must give to, send and support missionaries among unreached peoples in unreached places.

Today's China is a world of rapid change. It's home to over 1.4 billion individuals – one-fifth of the world's population. It's very different from the vast farmland Lottie Moon entered in the 1800s. But one thing hasn't changed: China's need for a Savior. (*Information taken from <u>www.imb.org.</u>*)
