Spring has finally arrived in East Tennessee! The trees are budding, and flowers are

breaking through the winter soil. Even the air has a twinge of something special about to happen. I wonder if it may have been that way when Mary, the mother of Jesus, and the other women were walking sorrowfully to the tomb of Jesus. Little did they know, they, and the entire world would be eternally altered by the events that were only moments away. Entering the garden with the purpose of completing what Joseph and Nicodemus has started prior to the Sabbath, seemed to be more than their hearts could manage. With their arms filled with supplies necessary to accomplish the task, suddenly they were frozen in their tracks. Their arms were emptied of supplies, and their eyes gazing in astonishment. "Oh, no," must have come from their lips. The stone was rolled away, and the body of Jesus was not there. Something special was happening. This Easter we will celebrate that something special with music, dramas, children's activities, and worship. For He is Risen!!

The Sweetwater Baptist Association is planning some special events for 2022, that we hope will enhance church participations, and kingdom growth. For these plans to be successful, your participation and commitment will be needed.

The first project will be held on Monday, March 21st at 7:00 pm at the Sweetwater Baptist Association office. This will be an Evangelism Training Conference for Pastors, Deacons, and other church leaders, called "Who's Your One". This workshop will be led by Chris Moore, Pastor of First Baptist Church in Madisonville. This program, by the North American Mission Board, combines praver and an intentional approach to winning your friend, neighbor, or working acquaintance to the Lord. This conference will also include the "3 Circles Evangelism" material which deals with "turning everyday conversations into Gospel conversations." Combining these studies will equip our people to share their personal testimonies with others. We are also including the book "Tell Someone" by Greg Laurie. These materials are written to encourage and inspire us to do what God had call each of us to do...win the lost. Each church in attendance will receive all these materials FREE of cost. Pastors, please mark your calendar for March 21st.

Second, this year's VBS Clinic will be in-person and livestreamed. The Clinic will be held on Monday, April 11th at Rocky Springs Baptist Church. This year's LifeWay theme is *Spark Studio: Created in Christ, Designed for God's Purpose.* The lessons begin with the creation story and conclude with the emphasis that God designed His creation for the purpose of sharing the wonderful story of Christ and His love for us. (*Those precious women who came to the tomb to mourn for Jesus would learn of this glorious life that grew out of such deep sorrow.*)

Third, this summer, the Sweetwater Baptist Association will have teams returning to the mission field in Iowa and Guatemala. Teams are now being formed to share the gospel and experience something special as we renew our commitment to Christ's call to GO. Reed Springs Baptist Church will be heading up the team to Iowa. If you are interested in joining their project, please contact Pastor Steven McDonald. Bethlehem Baptist Church will be leading a group to Guatemala. We are also exploring the option to have another small vision team to search out other areas of ministry in Guatemala. If you are interested in any of these projects, please contact the Associational Office for more information.

Finally, a *Pastor/Wife and Deacon/Wife Conference* is being planned for Monday, August 29th. This conference will be held at New Bethany Baptist Church in Sweetwater. Dr. Steve Holt, the Church Services Director with the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board, will lead the men's conference with topics including how today's deacon can fulfill the biblical mandates of servanthood in the church; how the roles of pastors and deacons are fellow laborers in kingdom building; and how caregiving for the flock was and is the biblical principle of deacon service. Nancy Duggin will be leading the women's portion of the conference. She is the widow of a long-term deacon and will share the important role the wife plays in helping her husband be a successful in ministry. A light meal will be provided to those in attendance.

We hope these events can help increase the ministry and potential growth of our churches for years to come. By involving the leadership of our churches with the strength of the core membership of the congregation, a great impact for the glory of Christ can be made in each of our communities. In John chapter 4, Jesus spoke with the woman at the well. When the disciples returned, Jesus starts a discourse on a harvest that is ready. With the experience of the past two years, surely the harvest is ripe. Christ has commissioned His church to be laborers as He provides the increase. The first step in creating a true sense of revival comes when the heart of the leadership and the congregation are convicted that God has called and empowered each of us to Share the Gospel.

Can you image the strange emotions that rushed through the women as they stood before the open tomb? All the questions that struggled for attention as their minds turned from one thought to another yet finding no answers. Unable to speak, finding comfort only in each other. Yet somehow, they knew something special was happening.

Could this Resurrection Morning be the start of something special in our churches? Try to project your thoughts one year from today. Each member has prayerfully sought the Holy Spirit's leadership in finding a friend or family member to share the Gospel with, and seen new believers enter the church. Don't stop there! Your Deacon Ministry has cared for that family, and other families have nurtured them in maturing in the Gospel. Revival will not be a week-long event; it will be a weekly event as souls are added to the kingdom and more disciples are sent to share the Good News.

IOWA: A partnership mission team from the Sweetwater Baptist Association will be traveling to lowa, July 16-22. These volunteers will work with local pastors and churches in a community near lowa City called Downey. The team will participate in



Vacation Bible Schools, revivals, and door-to-door witnessing. Please remember this mission team, as well as all other mission teams from our churches, as they share the love of Christ in our communities, across our state, country, and world.

GUATEMALA: The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board (TBMB) and Guatemala Baptist Convention have tentatively confirmed plans for Sweetwater Baptist Association mission projects in *Guatemala*



for 2022. Project dates are tentatively set for June 21-28 and September 13-20. Rules have changed for travel in and out of Guatemala. Everyone must be fully vaccinated (currently 2 doses) and present proof of negative COVID tests (administered within 3 days of check-in) for travel in and out of the United States. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport, as well as any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department. Teams must be held to a maximum of 15 mission volunteers.



Fort Sherman Academy Travel Security Training is required for all volunteers participating in upcoming mission projects in Guatemala. This online security training is valid for 2 years. In

addition to the Fort Sherman Travel Security, the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board requires all participants to complete online evangelistic, cross-cultural, and child protection training.



MYANMAR WELLS UPDATE: Praise the Lord! We have received word that the 20th water well in 2022 has already been dug in the country of Myanmar. (There were only 4 water wells dug in the year 2021.) This is during a time of civil unrest and a brutal military takeover in the country. Even while suffering from cruel government treatment, the people of Myanmar are so thankful and proud to have clean water for their daily

living. The water brings them hope, and is always accompanied by the message of Living Water, the real Hope! Thank you for sharing your love through this ministry.

Currently, we are not able to securely send funds directly to any of our known contacts in Ukraine. Banks have been closed, and even if we could wire any money, there is no way to guarantee the money would be received by the individuals it is being sent to.



The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board Disaster Relief is partnering with "Send Relief International" to help with providing for the needs of people in Ukraine. <u>Therefore, if any churches or individuals want</u> to contribute to the Ukraine relief effort, donations can be sent to our office and will be forwarded to the TBMB Disaster Relief. Just note on your check that it is for Ukraine.

The "Baptist and Reflector" shared this information about the work "Send Relief International" is doing in Ukraine: "Send Relief International began responding with food relief before the invasion and continues to ramp up its efforts...Send Relief continues to collaborate with national partners to provide food, shelter, transportation, clothing and ministry to those displaced and impacted by the crisis in Ukraine."



STREAMING/LICENSING ISSUES for CHURCH MUSIC: Some of our churches have reported problems with presentation of special music during livestreaming of services. This occurs especially when the



special music is being provided by either purchased performances tracks and/or iTunes purchased performance tracks. The Worship and Music Specialists of the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board offered the following help, if your church is experiencing this problem.

CCLI (<u>www.ccli.com</u>) offers a new solution to legally stream "accompaniment tracks." It's called the Streaming License Plus. If you contact them directly, they'll take care of you, or you can sign up online. There is a cost, starting at around \$210 per year. This license would be in addition to having the standard Christian Copyright License through CCLI.

Even when you have permission to legally stream recorded music (such as through the Streaming License Plus referenced above), Facebook's algorithms will sometimes still "block" and "flag" your services when they hear those tracks, because Facebook has no way to know consistently that you have permission to play these recordings. They will usually remove the "flag" once you let them know about your permission, but it can still take time and be a frustrating process.
