Tre Hargett Tennessee Secretary of State FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE MARCH 28, 2024 Secretary of State Tre Hargett Issues New Warning about Mail Scam Targeting Business Renewals

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Tennessee Secretary of State Tre Hargett issued a new warning to businesses across the state today about a deceptive mail scam related to the filing of annual business renewals from a company known as Tennessee Business Filing Center. As part of this scheme, businesses receive an official-looking mailer from the company threatening additional fees and business dissolution if an entity does not file within 60 days of the April 1 deadline.

"... Charitable Organizations and I have recently received multiple complaints regarding a misleading mailer requesting hundreds of dollars in fees from businesses to complete their annual renewal process," said Secretary Hargett. "We have seen similar situations in recent years targeting the good faith of our business community, and we want to remind all entities that our office provides these same services at substantially lower costs."

Businesses are required to complete their annual filings with the state by April 1 each year. These reports update or confirm an entity's records with the Department of State, and they are required to maintain "active status" so a business can legally operate in the file annual report. please an https://tnbear.tn.gov/Ecommerce/AnnualReportID.aspx.

"All Tennessee business owners should be wary of any mailing they receive from third parties offering services provided by our office." Secretary Hargett added. "These parties are not affiliated with us in any way, and we encourage businesses to report any suspicious activity related to this situation."

A team from Poplar Bluff will be working in a new ministry area with . Pastor Antonio at Iglesia Bautista Macedonia, Aldea La Union, Macedonia Baptist Church.

We are excited that a team from Bethlehem and Birchfield (Blount County) will be returning to continue on-going mission work with Pastor Hugo Barrios at the Jesus is the Way Baptist Church at El Cañal. In addition, this team will also work and visit the LaPalmita Baptist Mission and the Lamb of God Baptist Church where Pastor Fred Aguilar Osoria serves.

Various ministry opportunities for the teams include: (1) Ladies Bible Study (2) Men's Bible Study (3) Sports clinic/evangelism (4) Vacation Bible School (5) Door-to-door Witnessing (6) Evangelism, Crusade, Revival. Please pray for these teams as they travel to Guatemala, June 18-25 and June 25-July 2.

According to the US Embassy in Guatemala, there are no entry or exit requirements for COVID. Therefore, there are no COVID shots or testing required at this time. Please keep in mind that the Guatemala government could always change their mind before June. However, we do not anticipate any change in the requirements unless there is a large outbreak of COVID. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport, as well as any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department.

FORT SHERMAN TRAINING is required for all volunteers participating in upcoming mission projects in Guatemala. This online security training is valid for 2 years. In addition to the Fort Sherman Travel Security, the



Tennessee Baptist Mission Board requires all participants to complete online evangelistic, cross-cultural, and child protection training. Go to https://fsa.thinkific.com/courses/traveling-saint-online to complete FSA training.
