

As a witness of the churches struggling with this



Covid-19 virus, I am reminded of watching

my children and grandchildren learning to walk. Anxiety and frustration are expressed with each fall, while every step forward produces smiles and laughter. With outstretched arms, a toddler bounces forward seeking a resting place and a hug of approval.

Pastors have experienced a dual role of learner and leader simultaneously. You have traveled new and troublesome territory while guiding and protecting your flock. As a shepherd, you are responsible for the welfare of those under your care. Many of your parishioners have been willing and supportive members, while others have questioned and suggested other ways to traverse this new landscape. The dawning of each new day has brought unexpected obstacles that required earnest consideration from above. Your faithfulness to your congregation and remaining true to the call of God upon your life has been an encouragement to the community you serve.

With each wobbled step and tumble, a child must have the desire and courage to try again. They must learn failure will eventually lead to successfully reaching the goal of walking and eventually running the good race. GUATEMALA: The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board (TBMB) and Guatemala Baptist Convention have tentatively confirmed plans for Sweetwater Baptist Association mission projects



in Guatemala for 2021. Teams from Bethlehem and Union McMinn will be returning to continue on-going mission work with pastors and people of Guatemala. Project dates are set for July 20-27 and September 14-21.

Rules have changed for travel in and out of Guatemala. Proof of negative COVID tests will be required for travel in and out of the United States. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport, as well as any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department. Teams must be held to a maximum of 15 mission volunteers.

Fort Sherman Academy Travel Security Training is required for all volunteers participating in

upcoming mission projects in Guatemala. This online security training is valid for 2 years.

The Tennessee Baptist Mission Board requires all participants to attend an orientation training, as well as More-Life, cross-cultural, security, travel safety, and child protection training. Much of the training is available online or at the Sweetwater Baptist Association Office. Training dates will be scheduled as soon as possible.
