Baptist Church ordained me to the Gospel

Ministry. That is fifty years; half of a century; twenty-five years in each of the two centuries; and twenty years longer than my father lived. The day was sunny as family, friends, and church members filled the sanctuary. A nervous twenty-two-year-old boy sat in a chair at the altar to be guestioned by seasoned congregational leaders. Bennie Creel, the Director of Missions, along with pastors and deacons, made up the presbytery. I cannot tell you the names of all the ordained gentlemen that signed my certificate. The ink has faded, the names are gone, but the meaning and the memory live on. In preparation for the service, I was given the Articles of Faith, A Pastor's Handbook, and was told the guestions would come from these... "know them"! The greatest challenging statement that day did not come from one of the ministers, instead it came from my sister, Pasty. "Tony, if you are going to do this, do it right." Thirty-six years of pastoring and fourteen years of being the Director of Missions have brought me to today. Six churches, in six different associations, and two states, hopefully have equipped me for the remainder of my days in ministry.

Pastoring requires prayer, study of God's Word, a walk with the Master and truthful living. A minister is given an opportunity to preach hundreds of sermons, perform dozens of weddings, and provide comfort to families at funerals. It is such a privilege to be invited into people's lives. There is a lifetime of stories stored in the memory banks of a pastor's mind. Some create laughter while others bring tears. Some stories come from celebrations while others occur during conflict. God knows which memory to bring to recollection that fits the proper situation. I am humbled and thankful for each opportunity presented to me. Folks have loved my family and me. They have walked with me through the callings God has placed on my life and stood with me as my mother took her journey home.

One month after my ordination, a light blue tuxedo with ruffle sleeves clothed this same twenty-two-year-old boy. It was the same church, same nerves, some of the same people, yet a different coronation. Darnell was wearing a flowing white gown, holding a bouquet of daisies, and my attention. The words came easy that day but living them for fifty years has been a tremendous joy. She has traveled with me to almost every state in the union preaching the Gospel. She bought and kept my clothes, home, and schedule. She has been my greatest supporter and the most truthful critic because she loves me. Our marriage would be another lifelong commitment but this time we made the commitment together. The receiving of a wife is God's gift. In Genesis, the Lord God said, "It is not good for man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him." For a pastor, this is an understatement. A Godly wife is more than a helper. When a pastor's heart is broken, when his eyes overflow with tears of sorrow and helplessness, she understands. When a dear friend abandons and walks away, she remains.

From our relationship we have two children, Justin and Jana, as well as two grandchildren, Carly and Elizabeth. Along with our traditional

family, we have countless spiritual family members in every church we shepherded. Our family wants to celebrate fifty years, half of a century, twenty-five years in two centuries. We want to celebrate with family and friends. We want to celebrate what God has done; and we'd be honored if you celebrated with us. Our children are planning a *Golden Anniversary Celebration*, and you are invited! 

STAYING TO HELP, LONG AFTER THE WINDS DIE Even long after Hurricane Helene's devastating winds subsided, Tennessee Baptist volunteers can still be found restoring hope in East Tennessee. Westside Baptist Church in Madisonville is one of those churches serving as a beacon of sustained commitment. "When the hurricane hit up there, I called off services that Sunday night and we went to our mission building — which we built two years ago — just to start boxing up what we had, food, clothes, whatever we had to take up there," pastor Dwight Torbett explained. As a congregation of around 100 people, the church has placed 45 campers with families — many of whom are still living in tents — as well as delivered 33 trailer loads of supplies (like food, clothes, and hygiene products). Westside has had people from the community bring campers and drop them off and simply hand Torbett the title. They've received two vehicles that were in turn donated to families that lost vehicles. "If God sends it, we spend it," Torbett said with a smile. But he emphasizes, "It's a God thing. It's not a Westside thing." With this desire to aid in disaster relief, they plan to build a new warehouse facility, called the S.W.O.R.D., "Savior's Warehouse of Relief Donations". The church's ongoing relief efforts and plans to expand their facilities suggest the potential for the church to continue playing a significant role in supporting affected communities in the long term.


