the 190th Annual Meeting of the Sweetwater Baptist Association. Pastor Andrew did an excellent devotion, as he encouraged us to seek God's presence, whether we are in the village or a desolate place. Also, gratitude is passed to those in attendance who were considerate of others by wearing masks and social distancing. Everyone's cooperation provided a safe and successful Annual Meeting.

A highlight of the meeting was the presentation of the Myanmar funds to Carolyn Outland and Ann Davenport of Care Ministries. The churches of the Sweetwater Baptist Association gave in excess of \$48,000 to the poverty-stricken community. As soon as possible, fresh water will be flowing from the wells God has provided through your generosity. Imagine when the day comes, as you stroll through heaven and a stranger comes up to you and says, "thank you...you do not know me, but you gave me food when I was hungry, water when I was thirsty, and clothed me when I was naked." What a blessing that will be!

A new project was proposed for 2020-2021. Many of you are aware of the *Isaiah 117* house. This ministry is concerned for the care of children that are caught in a difficult family situation. On many occasions, the Department of Childrens Services is called into domestic situations that have become dangerous to the children. Emergency housing is required for these children until they can be placed in protective care. Presently these displaced children are sleeping on the floor at the DCS office or at another location, and this only adds to their disturbing circumstances. On an average 2-3 children need this protective care weekly. One house is being planned for Monroe and McMinn County. Adults often make bad choices that place these innocent children's lives in destructive situations. We are biblically challenged to care for the helpless of our society. Our goal in the *Isaiah 117* project is \$10,000. Please pray and give!

Our Moderator, Mitch Ingram and all the Association Committee Leadership presented encouraging reports and were extremely professional in fulfilling their duties for our congregations. We are blessed and honored to have people of high character filling these positions. Also, Sheri and Becky work tirelessly to make sure everything is carried out perfectly. We are blessed to serve our Lord through the Sweetwater Baptist Association.

Having just completed my 10th Annual Meeting, it is needless to say, there has been none like this one! Pastors, I have truly felt your pain! Four months into our 2019-2020 church year, things were looking great. Plans for a productive year were in place, and the promise of reaching the lost were breaking forth with the spring. However, God chose to allow a "we've never done it this way before" to shatter our plans and call us to seek His direction as we circumvent the course He has chosen for us. The God of our future promised to never forsake us. Therefore, we can expect God to do something great through His Church. It may be days, weeks or years before the

church realizes how God has moved during this pandemic. God does not act without the purpose to bring Himself glory. So, we can be assured that God is at work in our midst and His handprint is on the day in which we live. I, for one, am looking forward to seeing what God has done!

REPORT FROM ANNUAL MEETING, 2020: Even under the most unusual circumstances, Messengers gathered for the 190th Session of the Sweetwater Baptist Association. "Our Compass: The Cross" was the theme for the 2020 Annual Meeting. The opening welcome, devotion and prayer was



presented by Pastor Andrew Osakue, Vonore Baptist Church. Denise Bronaugh shared a word of greetings from the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board and presented a plaque to the Sweetwater Baptist Association on behalf of churches of the Association that participated in the *Golden Mission Offering*. The *Memorial Report* included *Dedication of the 2020 Minutes* of the Association in memory of retired or former pastors: Eddie McDaniel, Clinton Riddle, Russell Jones, Robert (Bob) Hatley, James (Jim) Millsaps and Barney Tipton. These men were dearly beloved and faithful servants to this Association and our Lord. They will be sadly missed.

Our Moderator, Mitch Ingram did an outstanding job in leading the Business Session. Items approved by Messengers included: Lewis Jones (Pastor of Island Creek) will serve as Moderator for 2020-2021 and Michael McLemore (Pastor of 411 Chapel) was elected as Vice-Moderator for 2020-2021; a land trade was made with the new property owner of adjoining property giving a triangle of land near the disaster relief building for a triangle of road frontage; churches were encouraged to pray for and receive an offering for *Isaiah 117* project in February 2021; and a proposed budget of \$186,223.00 was approved. We thank our Moderator, Mitch Ingram for his humble spirit and outstanding leadership this past year.

No items were presented by the Missions Committee for consideration; however, the *Missions Committee Report* indicated that churches have continued to be on mission here at home and around our world. In addition to the funds received for Myanmar, disaster relief supplies and funds were provided for devasting tornadoes and hurricanes in Tennessee and gulf coast regions. It was reported that Altoona withdrew membership from the Sweetwater Baptist Association. Short-term mission projects are being planned for 2021 in Guatemala and Iowa.

We want to thank 60+ Pastors, Messengers and visitors from churches represented that were in attendance for the sessions. We want to thank the host church, Vonore Baptist Church and Pastor Andrew Osakue. We also want to thank the Program Committee, and everyone that served on the program for this year's *Annual Meeting*. Please pray for the Program Committee as they plan and prepare for *Annual Meeting*, 2021. A NOTE OF THANKS: Sweetwater Baptist Association, "We thank our God upon every remembrance of you."
