FADING DAYS: Even though the temperature is still in the 90's, Vacation Bible Schools are slowly ending, and



summer is fading quickly. We are receiving good VBS reports from the churches. Many children have made professions of faith, and hopefully, church growth will follow as the new converts are "submerged" in the baptismal waters. We had the privilege of visiting more than 20 Vacation Bible Schools this summer. If you have not yet sent in your 2016 VBS Report to the SBA office, please do so.

The Sweetwater Baptist Association was represented in Guatemala in June. Teams from Bethlehem Baptist Church and Vonore Baptist Church conducted four Vacation Bible Schools, provided several dental clinics, led ladies Bible Study workshops, participated in door-to-door evangelism and revivals, and helped a construction team do electrical work on a church building. Through their efforts, approximately 150 people made professions of faith in Christ as Savior.

I had the privilege of visiting a dozen churches and missions in the Coatepeque area with Pastor Otto Echeverria, President of the Guatemala Baptist Convention. I prayed and spoke with pastors and church leaders about their needs. Some of our congregations may be able to help sister Guatemala churches in the Kingdom work. It is exciting to watch our volunteers labor beside fellow believers sharing the message of the Savior.

We are planning another trip to Coatepeque, Guatemala in September 2017. Several churches have shown interest in participating in the mission opportunity. In fact, some have already committed themselves to go and tell the Good News. If you would like more information concerning the 2017 mission outreach to Guatemala, contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association. Do not allow the fading days of summer to diminish your desire to be a witness for Jesus.

We received enough hygiene products to make a few hundred gift bags for the community give-away. The women's group from Bethlehem came to help organize the items, and several youth came to prepare the bags for give-away. The youth from Lakeside worked with the office staff on give-away day. They also delivered the care packages to the elderly in the community. To those who helped, thank you! Remember we have one more give-away planned. In November, we are giving away blankets for the needy. Begin looking now for blankets on sale as summer fades and fall slowly creeps in. Your warm gift will be appreciated all winter long.

Youth Reach, 2016 is now behind us. Before the sound of music brought by Life Wide Open fades, let me express gratitude to the Youth Committee for a job well done. There seemed to be more response to the messages and testimonies brought by Inky Johnson, Jacob Gilliam, and Shawn McBride than I had seen in some time. Over 400 people were moved by the Holy Spirit as we worshipped together. It is always humbling to be in the presence of a Holy God

whose desire is to fellowship with His children. May God continue to bless and keep you!

GUATEMALA MISSION PROJECT: In June, Tony Rutherford met with Pastor Otto Echeverria, President of Guatemala Baptist Convention. They visited several areas in Guatemala where little or no ministry work is being done. With this in mind, the Sweetwater Baptist Association



plans to participate in an evangelistic-type project in **September, 2017.** Our tentative dates are September 15-22. We are also hopeful that teams will return in 2017 to continue ministry projects and/or do further work in areas where ministry focus has already been established.

These evangelistic mission projects will be similar to the original vision planning trip in 2015. We would like to have 3-6 mission teams. Each team should consist of one pastor/preacher, with three to five additional members on each team to do work in the new locations.

Please contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association immediately if you are interested in leading and/or serving on a mission team in Guatemala. Applications and additional information are available at the Sweetwater Baptist Association office.

Mission volunteers must have a valid passport and routine vaccinations are required. Background screening is required for all participants. The Tennessee Baptist Convention requires all participants to attend an orientation meeting, as well as *More Life*, cross-cultural, security, safe travel, and child protection training. Training is available on-line and at the SBA Office.


