



BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: The Budget/Finance Committee

has reviewed all line items, and fine-tuned. modified and adjusted the amounts in each line item as needed to do ministry. Ministry is

not being cut, we are just being wise stewards of ministry funds. The Sweetwater Baptist Association office staff does most of the promotion, planning, printing, etc. for the ministry activities in-house, which reduces overall costs. With the current amounts of designated items, consideration for some items of the budget could be reduced until designated amounts are reduced or depleted. The Budget and Finance Committee recommends the following budget changes for the Proposed 2025-2026 Budget of the Sweetwater Baptist Association as follows:

- Increase Administrative Assistant by \$922.00 (To be distributed by employee: \$322.00 Salary, \$600.00 Retirement)
- Increase Ministry Assistant by \$832.00 (To be distributed by employee: \$232.00 Salary, \$600.00 Retirement)
- Increase Staff Social Security (Employer) by \$146.00 or a total of \$5658.00
- Decease Church Growth & Development by \$150.00 or a total of \$850.00 (This allows for one effective, high-quality conference with a church emphasis, as well as the annual Church Clerk Conference each year)
- Decrease Vacation Bible School by \$450.00 to \$1200.00 (This enables the promotion of VBS Showcase with purchase 5 kits for VBS Showcase, which are given away to the churches at the end of the Showcase; in addition, VBS designated funds are available.)
- Decrease Men's Ministry/Brotherhood by \$250.00 to \$500.00 (Numerous accounts are available to utilize for this area of ministry.)
- Decrease Disaster Relief by \$100.00 to \$500.00. (Numerous designated disaster relief accounts are available to assist in this area of ministry.)
- Decrease Biblical Studies by \$500.00 to \$500.00 (This allows for funds for instructor in the fall, in addition to available designated funds, plus per person that is collected each session for supplies from students.)
- Decrease Local Evangelism/Outreach by \$250.00 or a total of \$1400.00 (Numerous designated evangelism/outreach funds are available to assist in this area of ministry.)
- Decrease Student Scholarship by \$200.00 to \$2000.00 for the 4 scholarships at \$500.00 each (Books (if given to the recipient) can be purchased from the student/youth ministry line item, if needed.) 0 % overall increase Total Proposed Budget \$226,958.00


