HOPE FOR HAITI: We are now entering our second year of the 5year partnership with Pastor Gaétan Alcégaire and the orphanage, Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphan



in Haiti. During the past year, many of the Churches of our Association have responded in a great way to the needs in Haiti. Volunteers have participated in short-term mission projects to help build the church/school building and financial assistance is being provided for the 32 orphan children.

The orphanage is operated by Baptist Pastor Gaétan Alcégaire. He has transformed his family home into an orphanage/house for the children. In order to care for each child, \$80.00 per month is needed to provide food, clothing, shelter and schooling. If your church, Sunday School class,



WMU group cannot provide the full cost of \$80.00 per month to support a child, you can join with others who are providing partial support. Please pray how God would lead you to be part of this ministry.

HAITI MISSION PROJECT: Volunteers are URGENTLY needed to serve on a construction team for an upcoming Haiti mission project. The team will continue the work at the church/school building that is being constructed for Pastor Gaétan Alcégaire



and the Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphan. Block layers, and masonry workers, who can manually mix concrete, are especially needed for this phase of work. Tentative dates for the projects are February 16-23.

Volunteers should check with their local physicians to be sure that all required immunizations (such as Hepatitis A, B, C, Tetanus, Rabies, etc.) are up to date. It may be necessary for you to go to the Knox County Health Department for typhoid injections and/or malaria pills. The Knox County Health Department does require scheduled appointments and can be reached at 865-215-5000.

The approximate cost for the mission project is \$1400.00. A completed application and deposit should be submitted to the Sweetwater Baptist Association by <u>January 10, 2013</u>. You must have a valid passport to serve on the mission team.


13. Mike DeLand (Pastor of Walnut Grove Baptist Church) will serve as Moderator for 2012-13.
