



Who are Southern Baptists? The founding of The Southern Baptist Convention took place in Augusta, Georgia in 1845. Several issues caused the separation of the Baptist



movement in the United States. One of the most serious issues was slavery. However, other issues caused Baptist churches in the south to adopt four major doctrines to clarify their identity.

The first doctrine concerned the <u>view of the Scriptures</u>. Southern Baptists affirmed the authority of the Scriptures as the word of God. Scripture has "God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter."

The second doctrine addressed the **Deity of Jesus Christ**. "There is one and only one living and true God. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being."

The third doctrine put forth was the **Priesthood of the Believers**. Within the Southern Baptist Convention, all believers have the same rights and privileges as the local priest. No mediator is necessary to gain access to the Father. Christ becomes our intercessor. Each person is encouraged to be God's ambassador to a lost and dying world.

The fourth doctrine that helped Southern Baptists focus on lost and maintain our unique identity is the <u>autonomy of the local church</u>. "Members of New Testament churches should cooperate with one another in carrying forward the missionary, educational, and benevolent ministries for the extension of Christ's Kingdom." However, "no organization will have authority over one another or over the churches."

These statements of doctrine are given in an abbreviated form, and have served our Convention well, since its foundation. They have been highly valued and preserved over the years. (Much of this information was taken from *The Baptist Faith and Message, 2000.*) The reason these doctrines have weathered the storms of time is that wise men have known that issues can easily beset us from greater goals. In the Great Commission, Christ gave us in Matthew 28:19-20, it demands our vision upon the unreached, untrained, and unbelieving of our world.

From my pastorate days, I recall a story of two churches that I would like to share with you.

The first church was in deep debate. The flooring consisting of plywood, and throw rugs had served the congregation well for many years. Some felt it was time to go forward and lay the hardwood flooring that the original plans called for years ago. Yet, there were those who felt the sub-flooring and rugs were more than adequate for the "meeting house." At times, the debate grew heavy. Comments were hurled across the room like spitballs in a one-room schoolhouse. The issue was laid aside for one week of prayer and meditation.

Gathering one week later did not seem to cool the tempers of the outspoken individuals who truly felt they were doing the best for the church. After more discussion, a vote was finally taken. The sub-flooring would soon be covered with new tongue-and-grooved hardwood. Saturday was the appointed day that all the men would bring their tools. Bending upon their knees, they would carefully lay the flooring. The women would gather around noon and bring in much needed nourishment for the workers.

A moment of fear swept through the pastor's heart as he saw the black Ford pull into the driveway. It was the first car to arrive. It was the leader of the opposition (the sub-flooring is good enough spokesperson). What would happen now? To the pastor's surprise, the gentleman opened the trunk of his car and pulled out a tool belt filled with a hammer, tape, and other items. He came to work. The man laid more flooring than any other worker did that day.

Another nearby church seemed to be caught in a similar confrontation. Some felt it was time to pave the driveway, while others declared it would be money wasted. Surely, the vote would settle the issue and all would calm down. Everyone knows that cooler heads and time heals all wounds. After the vote was approved, the job was given to the lowest bidder.

It was noticeable to those who were aware of the confrontation inside the church that a silent protest was taking place outside the building. Until his last days, the anti-paving representative refused to park on the pavement.

I am not sure God is so much concerned about our flooring or our pavement, but He is concerned about our attitudes. Which of the two men demonstrated wisdom and did the will of the Father? Which of these men let issues distract them from the greater goal of The Great Commission? Let us commit ourselves to His task that is before us.

**GUATEMALA (Tennessee Baptist Convention) MISSION PROJECT:** The Tennessee Baptist Convention has asked the Sweetwater Baptist Association to participate in a pilot project in Guatemala. The mission



project will focus in the Pacific Coast region, and will be September 29-October 6, 2015. The volunteer mission team will need up to 30 people to serve on revival teams and we will need 6-8 preachers for a Crusade.

The Tennessee Baptist Convention is requiring all participants to attend orientation training in February or April. This will include More Life training, cross-cultural and (3-hour) security training. Much of the training will be available on-line. The cost for the mission project is approximately \$1200-1500 per person. This includes airfare, lodging, meals and in-country transportation. The cost does not include: passport, passport photos, medical/vaccinations, snacks, required child protection training and background screening, and required travel safety training.

HOPE FOR HAITI: Our Association of Churches continues to respond in a great way to the on-going partnership mission in Haiti. Our churches provide for orphanage children at the by Pastor Gaetan operated Alcegaire. Food, clothing, shelter and schooling are furnished for the children. In addition to providing support for the orphan children, construction continues at the new church/school building at the Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphanage operated by Pastor Gaetan.







Last year, a construction company was contracted to provide the metal beams and steel for the roof support that is between the first and second floors of the building. This

work has been completed, and the Director of Missions returned from a trip to Haiti in August to view the on-site work. Pastor Gaetan and other workers from the Children's Orphanage were hired to lay the concrete blocks for the second floor of the building.

<u>Now we need your</u> <u>help!</u> In February of 2015, a team of construction workers from the Sweetwater Baptist Association will be needed to build the rafters and roof the building. <u>Please</u> contact the Sweetwater



Baptist Association office, if you would like to be part of the upcoming mission project and serve on the construction mission team. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport and would need to get any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department.

Please continue to pray for Pastor Gaetan, the children at the orphanage, construction teams, the building project and how God would lead you to be a part of a short-term mission team or share in this ministry as we work to share the love of Christ in the country of Haiti.

During the Business Session, a proposed budget of \$164,133.00 was approved by Messengers. The total overall increase in the budget was \$940.00 or less than 1%. David Chambers (Pastor of Altoona Baptist Church) was elected as Vice-Moderator for 2014-2015 and Roman Hamilton (Pastor of Poplar Bluff Baptist Church) will serve as Moderator for 2014-2015.

Missions Committee Chairman, Don Rockholt reviewed the 2013-2014 work of the Association, which included continuing construction at school/orphanage building project in



Haiti, medical care provided by RAM, workday on sanctuary at Williamsburg and World Changers being planned for 2015. It was reported that the new church start-up, The Fellowship Church has met all requirements for petitioning the Sweetwater Baptist Association for membership, and has been taken under the watch-care of the Association pending vote of Messengers at the 2015



Annual Meeting. It was further reported that the Missions Committee has accepted a request from the Tennessee Baptist Convention to participate in a pilot mission project to

Guatemala in 2015.

Incoming Missions Committee Chairman, Chris Farmer was recognized. He requested that the Missions Committee reconvene to discuss matters.
