THE RULES:

"She was along just for the fun of it." Hayrides and wiener roasts are a part of growing up. The tragic thing is sometimes



the best of plans goes wrong. The rules are

given before the night's festivities begin. They sound the same every time, so no one really listens. "Do not get too close to the fire. Let the adults help with the sticks. Do not jump off the wagon once we have started. Do not throw things. Be sure you do not push and shove." As darkness settles in our valley, the gang of young men and women are gathering for an evening that creates memories for adolescence. The cool night air is driven away by the crackling embers of the bonfire. Mittens are exchanged for a wooden stick upon which is placed the American tradition, a hot dog. Standing close to the fire, the hands are getting hot. The wind changes direction causing the smoke to fill the eyes. Uncontrollable tears ran down the face. Little does anyone realize they are tears of premonition.

A ton of hot dogs, marshmallows, and s'mores are consumed. Bodies are bundled in coats, scarves, and caps. Hands are protected by gloves. All that is left exposed to the night air is the nose. The tractor coughs and belches as smoke rises into the sky. The smell of diesel acts as an alarm clock calling the young, and young at heart, to find their place amid the straw and bales of hay.

The hayride is a southern tradition. Many tender hearts have fallen in love beneath a moonlit sky, while holding hands and singing songs. The wagon of excited adventures makes its way over the bumpy field. Only hours before cattle had instinctively traveled this path to the barn. This evening the pasture had been reserved for pleasure. As children will be children, someone forgets the rules. A small attempt of trickery leads to tragedy. A girl falls off the wagon and is run over. Some would say, "rules are meant to be broken," and "accidents happen." Others would place blame on the group, the driver, the hay, or God Himself. Everyone would think the price of such an error is too great. This is often the tragedy of coming to maturity. Today, maybe there is not an answer, but in Christ there is comfort.

The above story comes from a true event from my pastoral experience. Many of you have been faced with similar tragedies in your congregation. Sometimes the best way to minister to such hurt is to just sit and cry with the family. Job's friends sat with him for a week before saying a word. Even though their assumption was wrong, their action communicated love for Job.

Christ gave us rules to abide by to traverse life that will lead the follower safely home. There are three words that come to my mind: repent, believe, and obey. Jesus' message was a universal call to repent or to change the direction of their thinking concerning God, and how God was reaching out to humanity (Matthew 4:17). When Jesus proclaims the command to repent, it is a call to allow Jesus to reign in the heart of the believer. Jesus challenged their traditional view of Messiah. Before the religious Jew could move from cold ritual to relationship their mind and heart had to reverse action to open to the possibility that Jesus was the Son of God.

In John 3:36, the author John stresses the word believe. He says: "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that

believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him." The apostle, that Jesus loved, uses the term "believe" to magnify the follower's relationship with Christ. John believed the true believer would allow faith in Christ to greatly impact the Christian lifestyle. Therefore, the words of the believer would match the way the person lives (I John 1:6-7). It is not simply saying "I believe," following the rules creates a pattern of obedience.

This brings us to the final rule of survival: Obey. Samuel challenges King Saul's disobedience in I Samuel 15:22. King Saul had defeated the Amalekites in battle. Saul had been instructed to destroy the Amalekites and their livestock. Saul had kept some of the spoils, and he claimed the animals were for sacrifice to the Lord. Samuel's response was "Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice." Jesus said, "all who love me will do what I say" (John 14:23). Obedience is a response to God's gracious invitation and is lived as a dependance and intimacy with God.

It seems to be true that when we violate the rules, there is a consequence that appears to be unfair. Often the price is greater than we expected. Who would think that a small prank would carry a soul into eternity? Is that what is happening within our congregations? Satan's little tricks have eternal consequence. The rules may seem old-fashioned, but they are worth living by! — *Tony*


