Herod also ordered the death of all male children two years old and younger at the time of Jesus' birth. These men were taking steps to preserve "their" kingdom. The rationale of the young man from Connecticut may never be known or understood.

Madness has always been a part of our society. The Devil has engaged in an attack against the Church of Jesus Christ. Throughout history, Satan has attempted to defeat the spirit and will of the believers. His actions cause many to question the existence of a loving Father who cares for His children. "How can a God who is supposed to be in control allow events like this?" many asked. In the mist of hurt, pain, and inconsolable grief, it is the grace of God that brings comfort. Matthew records the words of Jesus as Christ speaks of the "little ones". "That in heaven their angels do always behold the face of my Father which is in heaven." A Christian should not be surprised to find the compassionate hand of God when tragedy strikes.

The outpouring love and kindness of people from around the world toward the community of Newtown demonstrates that evil does not win and neither will Satan. As long as God's children are in this world, they would come under assault from the evil one. Baptists are known as people who sing our faith. Any Southern Baptist can sing "Victory in Jesus" without looking at the hymnal. Our prayer is that everyone could experience that victory and leave the madness behind.

Please be in prayer as another team of volunteers prepare to journey to Haiti to work with the orphanage. We will be leaving on February 2nd and returning the 9th. A team of four women will be working with the school and providing a Bible School in the afternoon. The seven men will continue working on the first floor of the multipurpose building. Prayer is an essential element in succeeding in God's work. Many of our churches have been faithful in providing funds and prayer for the mission endeavor. May the Lord continue to keep the vision of these little ones before us!

This year's Evangelism Conference was held at Notchey Creek Baptist Church. What our world needs is *More Life*. Christ came to bring "abundant life" (John 10:10). Dr. Bobby Welch the Associate Executive Director/Church Growth of the Tennessee Baptist Convention was our guest speaker. His message encouraged us to experience "More Life" than ever before. Also, he challenged us to see the "Harvest" that awaits the church of Tennessee. The population of the lost is increasing at an alarming rate in our communities. The Church must gird up our minds to do the work of the Master. Our neighbors need us to be zealous concerning our faith. The eternal destiny of those we know and love may depend on us telling them the story of Jesus and what He has done for us. We pray you were challenged and encouraged from God's Holy Word. The Sweetwater Baptist Association extends a special thank you to Pastor Gale Miller and Notchey Creek Baptist Church for hosting the Evangelism Conference. We also wish to express a special thank you to Phillip Johnson and the Associational Choir for an outstanding job in leading us in worship.

CHRISTIAN COUNSELING CENTER: Acts 2 tells about a group of people gathered together




in an upper room. These people were scared, confused, hopeless, and looking for

OFFICE MINISTRY UPDATE: The Tennessee Baptist

Convention will present Office Ministry Update on



February 11-12 at the Loudon County Baptist Association Office in Lenoir City. This two day conference for church and associational ministry assistants will provide seven blocks of learning including: communicating with clarity through email, social networking and other current tools, event planning, maximizing your time, creating policies for continuity, managing finances, and others. The cost is \$45.00 per person for the 2-day conference. Registration is available online at www.tnbaptist.org. **INFORMATION FOR CHURCH TREASURERS:** The IRS requires all charitable organizations (including churches) to provide written receipts for individual donations of \$250.00 or more.



For amounts less than \$250.00, a written receipt is not required, however, it is recommended that churches provide an annual itemized statement to each of its contributors, regardless of the amount of the donation.

The statement should cover the Jan-Dec tax year and given to the contributor in a timely manner, for use in filing their income tax return.

This written statement should include the following information:

- 1) the name and address of the church;
- 2) the date and amount of each donation;

3) a statement that the only benefit received in lieu of the donation was intangible religious benefit (meaning no goods or services were given to the individual making the donation).

JUST A NOTE: The SBA Office has a supply of carbonless forms W2, W3, 1099 and 1096. These are available to our churches and are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please stop by the SBA Office to pick up the forms that are needed for your church.




