A small team of volunteers from our association recently returned from

Haiti. Their purpose was to prepare the land, dig the footer, lay the re-bar, and pour the foundation for the church/school building at the Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphanage in Haiti. After much prayer, determination and hard work, the stated purpose was achieved. God worked miraculously to bring about the success of the operation. He used the teamwork of the group, as well as the willingness of the locals. Many thanks go out to Denny Moore, Ronnie Moore, B.J. Wall, and Pastor Geatan and his workers.

Returning from Haiti has allowed me the opportunity to process what my eyes saw, my ears heard, and my soul felt. My mind has worked overtime trying to absorb everything that has attacked my five senses. The sights, smells, tastes, sounds, and the things felt have a way of lingering. For the most part, the poverty that surrounds the people almost goes unnoticed. Each family is busy struggling and striving to meet their daily needs. Men push and roll wheel-barrows for miles to collect abandoned scrap-iron. Ladies walk the street with baskets of fruit or bread on their heads to sell to their neighbors. Younger girls glide through the streets with five gallon buckets of water on their heads not spilling a drop.

A week after we departed Port-au-Prince, Hurricane Isaac dumped intense rain and brought strong winds. Several lives were lost, much of the tent cities were damaged and we heard from Pastor Geatan several days later. Our prayer is that all is well at the orphanage, and that the work will not be delayed. How much can a person take? To endure earthquakes, hurricanes, rejection or loss of family, and whatever comes next. The crushing of the spirit is truly heavy on the victims. I am grateful that Christ promised His children that He would never leave them or forsake them. Truly now is a time for prayer, because we know the need remains.

When the Sweetwater Baptist Association voted to adopt this project in the 2011 Annual Meeting, I was excited and fearful of the task that lay before us. The economical times seemed bleak, a new and unproven DOM had moved in, and a sense of the home-front needing attention weighed heavy on my heart. Yet, many of our congregations have risen to the challenge to take a vision and turn it into a reality. It takes faith and courage to answer the call to go the second mile in ministry. Churches and individuals have prayed, given, and sacrificed to care for these children. Thank you for your generosity and heartfelt compassion. There is still time for other churches to get involved in this mission which will outlive our lives. Henry Blackaby teaches that to experience God, we must accept God size challenges, and truly Haiti meets those requirements. Other trips are in the planning stage. Presently we are looking for people who are skilled in masonry. Please contact the associational office for more information.

Presently, there are no major business issues for consideration. Hopefully, we can make this event an occasion to "Celebrate Redemption." God's grace has brought victory through simultaneous revivals, tornados, and mission opportunities. Through our association of churches, groups have reached out to Kentucky, lowa, Mexico, Honduras, Brazil, Haiti, and other projects. Countless local ministries have been provided. These ministries have changed and encouraged lives, and have brought glory to our Heavenly Father. Therefore, there is reason to "Celebrate Redemption."

On Monday, October 29 the Association is providing an evening of studying the Passion of Christ. This would be a great opportunity for pastors and teachers to look into the week of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. This study will walk us through each day of the week before Christ's crucifixion and conclude with the glorious resurrection. It will make an excellent spring sermon series or a series of teaching events that will highlight the Easter season. Dr. Chad Hartsock from Carson-Newman College will be with us to lead the study. The class will be from 7:00-9:00 pm. There is no cost for attending the class. However, there will be a fee if you wish to purchase the Winter Bible Study materials.

PROJECT: A short-term mission team of volunteers (Robert "Denny" Moore, Ronnie Moore, B.J. Wall and Tony Rutherford) just returned from Haiti in late August. The team joined Pastor Gaetan and local Haitian



workers to begin the first phase of construction at the church/school



site. Workers prepared the building site, dug footers, and began pouring the footers. Haitian workers will complete the footers. We are so thankful for the work that has been done.

A second mission

project is being tentatively planned for February, 2013 to continue the next phase of work at the building site. Skilled laborers and masonry workers are needed who can manually mix concrete, carry and lay block. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport and would need to get any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department. Applications for the mission project are available on our website at www.sweetwaterbaptistassociation.com. If you would like to be part of this mission project, a completed application and deposit must be returned to the SBA Office.

Please continue to pray for Pastor Gaetan, the children at the orphanage and how God would lead you to share in this ministry as we work to share the love of Christ in the country of Haiti.
