The 2012-13 church year is drawing to an end. In many of our churches, the plans for the next year are on the drawing board, ready to be shared with the congregation. During this time of year, it is not uncommon to hear the accusation that Baptists are just about budgets and buildings. However, our historical roots say this is not true. We have long been people of the Book. From the Book, we understand our call to missions and ministry. When the faithful servant is captured by the vision that God has cast for His children, the focus becomes clearer and the direction of our commitment becomes unified: missions and ministry.

Evangelistic missions and ministry will reenergize our sluggish efforts to win the lost at any cost. The stirring of the baptismal waters, which once reminded us of the baptism of Jesus or the healing of the man who was crippled for 38 years, have become only a ripple in our memories. This year's annual meeting theme is "I Stand Amazed." God is still in the amazing business. As in days gone by, God still wants to pour out His blessings on His children. We sing of God's "Amazing Grace," and how that grace has saved us and set us free. With the condition of our world today, that same grace is the solution for our woes.

I don't know if there will ever be another Pentecost as is described in the book of Acts, but I pray for one. One of the unenviable tasks for our association at this meeting will be to vote on a budget that will cause us to operate on fewer

funds. Time and economics have caught up with our budgeting process. We have tried to maintain the level of activity over the previous years at the same rate of support. However, the cost to operate has steadily increased. As churches have struggled to adjust their mission and ministry efforts based on their income, so does the association. We have studied this trend for a couple of years and need to make the adjustment now. Also, we will continue to work with the budget committee closely in the coming years.

Now on a personal note, I wish to express a deep level of gratitude for those who have been praying for Darnell. Because of a severe kidney stone attack she was temporarily hospitalized. With your prayers and God's use of the medical team, her treatment has been successful. She is improving and is able to be active in church.

Now I need your prayers. Carly, my 6 year-old granddaughter, is going to participate in a 5K run, and she has persuaded her "Poppo" to run (walk) the race with her. She wants to win! I want to finish! The words of Paul flow through my mind, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith....." When I see you at the Annual Meeting, you will be my witness. I survived!

SEMINARY EXTENSION CLASS: The fall session was scheduled to begin on September 3rd. However, students can still sign-up until Sept. 24th. The course study is *Philippians*, *Colossians*, *Philemon*.
