#### GUATEMALA (Tennessee Baptist Convention) MISSION PROJECT: In 2015, the Tennessee Baptist Convention asked the Sweetwater

Convention asked the Sweetwater Baptist Association to participate in a pilot project in Guatemala. The Association responded to this request



by providing five mission teams to serve in the Pacific Coast region. Teams participated in door-to-door evangelism, crusades, revivals, etc. It was reported that fifty-one people accepted Christ during the week-long project.

Plans now are for mission teams to return to Guatemala in 2016, to work in same locations and continue ministry work that was begun. The missionary in Guatemala recently shared with our office that the Pacific Coast area is one of the largest regions, so there is potential for more of our churches to work in other churches in this region of Guatemala. Please contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association if you or your church is interested in serving on a revival mission team in Guatemala in 2016.

The Tennessee Baptist Convention requires all participants to attend an orientation meeting, as well as training in More-Life, crosscultural, security, travel safety and child protection. They also require a complete background screening. Much of the training is available on-line. **HOPE FOR HAITI:** Churches of the Sweetwater Baptist Association continue to provide for children at Foundation Yaveh Shamma for the Children Orphanage operated by Pastor Gaetan Alcegaire. Food, clothing, shelter and schooling are furnished for the orphan children.



In addition to providing support

for the children, construction continued at the new church/school building. In February of 2015, a team of workers

from the Sweetwater Baptist Association traveled to Haiti to build the rafters and roof the building. Locals were enlisted to stucco and paint the outside of the building, as well as tile the top floor of the building. Pews have been purchased for the building, and the new building



dedication service was held in August of this year.

<u>Now we need your help!</u> In February of 2016, a volunteer mission team project is being planned for the Sweetwater Baptist Association. We need a mission team of 8-10. This group will work with the children at the orphanage to do an on-site Vacation Bible School. We also need a small electrical/construction team to install fans in the church/school building. In addition, leadership from another Association will be traveling with our mission team as part of a vision team to examine the ongoing work at the school and orphanage.

Please contact the Sweetwater Baptist Association office, if you would like to be part of the upcoming mission project and serve on this mission team. Mission volunteers must have a valid passport and would need to get any required vaccinations from their doctor or health department.

As we enter the final year of our partnership in the country of Haiti, please continue to pray for Pastor Gaetan and the children at the orphanage. Pray that other Associations may come forth, at the conclusion of our partnership, to provide for their needs and work to share the love of Christ in the country of Haiti.

REPORT FROM ANNUAL MEETING, 2015: "New Life....In Christ" was the theme



for the Sweetwater Baptist Association, 2015 Annual Meeting as we gathered for worship and business.

Dr. John Powers, Pastor, First Baptist Church, Delano shared the mission message during the first session. He reminded us that where there is no vision, the people perish. Special music was provided by the Associational Choir and led by Phillip Johnson. Dedication of the 2015 Minutes of the Association was presented in memory of Bruce Newman,

a much loved and faithful servant of God. Wife, Susan Newman, and daughter, Leah Newman Waller were in attendance to receive the dedication memorial.

A special thank you to our Moderator Roman Hamilton, for his humble spirit and outstanding leadership this past year. The Moderator's Message, *I/we Need a Little More Jesus*, was



presented during the second session. Special music was provided by Lance Hamilton, Debbie Martin and Laura Harris.

During the Business Session, a proposed budget of \$165,248.00 was approved by Messengers. The total overall increase in the budget was \$1,115.00 or less than 1%. Dwight Torbett (Pastor of Westside Baptist Church) was elected as Vice-Moderator for 2015-2016 and David Chambers (Pastor of Altoona Baptist Church) will serve as Moderator for 2015-2016.



Missions Committee Chairman, Chris Farmer reviewed the 2014-2015 work of the Association, which included continued construction at the school/orphanage

building in Haiti, World Changers teams, and mission team to Guatemala as part of Tennessee Baptist Convention vision project. It was reported that Conasauga Baptist Church had met all requirements for petitioning the Association for membership and has been taken under the watchcare of the Association pending vote of Messengers at the 2016 Annual Meeting. Ronnie Best is pastor at Conasauga.

Mission Committee Recommendations approved by Messengers included (1) Working Agreement for a minimum of 6 months with Union Hall to be placed under the supervision of the Association (2) Acceptance of The Fellowship Church for membership as a participating church in the Sweetwater Baptist Association.

We want to thank 250+ Pastors, Messengers and visitors that were in attendance for the sessions. We want to thank host churches, Watson Chapel, Madisonville and Pastor Ronnie Blair, and Long Ridge, Tellico Plains and Pastor Carroll Hamilton. We also want to thank the Program Committee, and everyone on the program that helped make this year's Annual Meeting a blessed time of worship. Please pray for the Program Committee as they plan and prepare for Annual Meeting, 2016.
